Staying Safe: COVID-19 Precautions at the Palais

The SIU continues to monitor the ever-changing global health landscape in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Through selection of a well-equipped venue with rigorous standards, the SIU is confident it can continue to safely host in-person events that bring urologists together.



The Québec government has lifted most of the public health measures associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Starting March 12, 2022, the vaccination passport is no longer required in Quebec. However, presenting a proof of vaccination remains mandatory, according to federal government requirements, for travel within and outside Canada, by train, plane or cruise ship.
- The requirement to wear a mask or face covering is gradually being relaxed. To find out more, see the Wearing a mask or a face covering in public settings in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic page.
- However, you must continue to follow the basic health instructions.

Precautions taken by the SIU 2022 venue, the Palais des Congrès de Montréal, include:

- International sanitary certification GBAC Star obtained in 2022.
- Housekeeping services that reflect the new era of cleaning, combining disinfecting and sanitizing.
- Frequent cleaning of contact surfaces.
- Additional handwashing stations and hydroalcoholic gel dispensers placed at room entrances and high-traffic areas.

- High-performance ventilation systems subjected to a preventive maintenance program, and filters are replaced regularly.
- Use of a one-step, hospital-grade disinfectant cleaner based on AHP® (accelerated hydrogen peroxide) technology that delivers fast, effective results.
- Restaurants and catering can resume with 100% of the capacity, with 1m physical distancing between tables.
- Wearing a mask is mandatory when moving around in the Palais; people who are seated quietly (or speaking softly) may remove their mask.
- Adhering to the one-met e physical-distancing rule and minimizing the number of people in event spaces.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO STAY SAFE:



It is important to always be aware of and maintain social distancing (2m between people), wear a mask, and follow proper hygiene protocols, including frequent hand washing, sanitization and cough/sneeze etiquette.



We ask for your help in ensuring your own safety and the safety of your colleagues by following directional signage put in place in the venue and complying to the regulations and restrictions required by the venue, SIU, and any local public health authorities.

WORKSHOPS:

PROSTATE MRI READING AND FUSION BIOPSY

This course will take you through an in-depth overview of the basic principles of multiparametric MRI (mpMRI) as well as current applications of MRI-US fusion-guided biopsies. The workshop part of the course will give participants insight into the reading and interpretation of prostate MRI and their application for MR-US fusion.

Learning Objectives:

At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

- Recall key features of systematic prostate MRI reading according to PI-RADS standards
- Read and report basic and intermediate level prostate MRI with confidence
- Recognize the technical features and capabilities of prostate biopsy and fusion technology using MRI for targeting
- Identify the key requirements to safely integrate MRI into the prostate diagnostic pathway



CONGRESS EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES TRAINING WORKSHOPS cont'd

LASERS AND MISTS IN LUTS/BPH

BPH diagnosis and treatment represents the largest segment of urological practice—specifically, 23% of all office visits. One of the major challenges for practicing physicians is recognizing, understanding, and implementing innovative procedures, and updating their knowledge with regards to disease processes and new treatment guidelines for the benefit of their patients. With so many treatment modalities available, physicians are tasked with selecting the optimal therapies for their patients; this is particularly critical given the rise in aging populations and the extensive burden that LUTS/BPH can have on quality of life.

This course will review novel BPH therapies for office-based treatments of LUTS/BPH, including Aquablation®, HoLEP, Rezūm™, and UroLift®. The hands-on course will provide practical applications of these technologies in terms of equipment, technical approach, and high-level review of clinical data. The faculty will provide first-hand practical instruction on best practices including patient selection, technique selection, and tips and tricks. The faculty will provide international experience and evidenced-based summaries of the risks and benefits of these procedures, to aid with patient counselling for informed consent.

Learning Objectives:

At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

- Understand the mechanism of action and technique for each BPH therapy
- Select the most appropriate patient for each procedure type, based on patient and prostate characteristics
- Know the clinical data supporting the use of each modality
- Apply the best-practice technique for each modality, based on the literature and expert opinion
- Recognize the challenges associated with each technique and perform appropriate trouble-shooting
- Practice tips and tricks provided by the experts for executing these novel BPH therapies

ROBOTICS – TIPS AND TRICKS FOR BEGINNERS

This course is intended for urologists in their first 100 robotic surgery cases using the DaVinci Si and Xi platforms. This course incorporates video, specific case discussions, and diagrams based on experience, and is presented by urologists with more than 1,000 cases.

Learning Objectives:

At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

Identify appropriate cases for:

- Docking and trocar placement in order to avoid collision in difficult anatomy patients
- Selecting to use a 0- or 30-degree lens

Demonstrate skills in the following:

- Suturing in a narrow space
- Robotic movements that are uncommon with laparoscopy
- · Optimizing instruments
- Managing difficult anatomy (short, obese, hepatomegaly, big and small prostate, medial lobe, adhesions)

LAPAROSCOPIC SKILLS (BOX TRAINER)

This course is intended for the urologist who wants to improve their laparoscopic suture skills. It is entirely based on video and individual practice using a box trainer, with the guidance of an instructor for each workstation.

Learning Objectives:

At the end of this course, the participant should be able to demonstrate the following skills:

- In 2D vision, coordinating proper needle angle and movement
- · Placing the trocars to facilitate the suture
- Suturing in different planes
- Establishing the methodology to suture intracorporeally
- Knotting technique and extracorporeal knotting without pusher

The session will be chaired by world-renowned international faculty and will cover a wide variety of topics.

This educational activity is designed to incorporate evidence-based medicine into the treatment of

urological disorders in clinical practice. Speakers will use their personal, institutional, and evidence-based experience to address patient healthcare conditions requiring clinical and surgical treatment.

The SIU Semi-Live Surgical Demonstration programme will address the learners' gaps in knowledge by allowing them to update their understanding of cutting-edge surgical techniques, grounded in evidence-based medicine, that will impact local/regional practice patterns, with the ultimate goal of improved patient outcomes.



Learning Objectives:

At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

- Recognize important perioperative considerations and techniques for reconstructive urologic surgery, including selecting the best reconstructive approach to optimize treatment outcomes.
- Demonstrate practical knowledge of instrumentation and techniques for the endourologic treatment of upper and lower urinary tract conditions, including the management of special clinical cases.
- Examine the role of micro-ultrasound and focal therapy approaches in the management of radiorecurrent prostate cancer.
- Recognize the advantages and limitations of open surgery, laparoscopic, and robotic-assisted procedures in uro-oncology, with respect to novel devices, instrumentation, and techniques.
- Evaluate their own role in patient management, from multidisciplinary care to treatment outcomes, based on the clinical experience of key opinion leaders in the surgical management of urologic conditions.






